All Island Schools' Western Music & Dance Competition 2025

The Aesthetic Branch of the Ministry of Education, Higher Education and Vocational Education conducts this competition annually to promote the performance of Western Music among students in the country.

1.0 Aims and Objectives

- 1.1 To highlight and nurture student talent in Western music and dance through a national-level platform.
- 1.2 To promote cultural exchange and appreciation through Western performing arts.
- 1.3 To inspire creativity, innovation, and confidence in student performances.
- 1.4 To Foster teamwork and collaboration through group performances.
- 1.5 To recognize and reward excellence with certificates.
- 1.6 To encourage participation from schools across the island to ensure inclusivity.
- 1.7 To instill values of sportsmanship through structured and fair judging.
- 1.8 To promote Western music and dance as integral to school education.
- 1.9 To unite students, educators, and stakeholders to build a thriving artistic community.

2.0 General Rules

- 2.1 This competition is open to all Government, Semi-Government, Private, and International schools in the country.
- 2.2 Participation is mandatory for all schools employing a state-appointed Western Music teacher.
- 2.3 Schools violating the Ministry's rules will face disqualification.
- 2.4 Participating schools will be categorized as follows:

2.4.1 **Category A1**:

All Government schools where students are trained by a Professional Instructor.

All Semi-Government, Private, and International Schools.

2.4.2 **Category A2**:

All Government schools (where training is conducted exclusively by the Western Music teacher or another member of the school staff.

- 2.6 For the relevant categories of all items, the Senior and Open groups will compete together in this competition. This means participants from both groups will be evaluated under the same criteria and judged collectively within their respective categories.
- 2.5 Instrumental accompaniment may be played by the school's music teacher or a student. Pre-recorded piano accompaniment may also be used, but in both cases, the teacher is prohibited from conducting.
- 2.7 The maximum time for performances, including stage entry, is 10 minutes. Penalty marks will be deducted for exceeding the time limit.
- 2.8 Participants must adhere to the specified dress code (except for dance items):
 - Girls: White short/long-sleeved shirt or blouse with a collar and a black skirt (skirt length 1 inch below the knee) or white shirt with black trousers.
 - Boys: White short/long-sleeved shirt with black trousers.
 - Note: Ties, bows, or accessories revealing the school's identity are prohibited.
- 2.9 First-place winners of solo items in the previous competition are not eligible to apply for the same item in this competition.
- 2.10 Students participating in the Provincial round cannot be substituted at the National round.

3.0 Groups

3.1	Junior	Grade 6 to Grade 9
3.2	Senior	Grade 10 to Grade 13
3.3	Open	Combination of all age groups
3.4	Mixed	Girls & Boys (only for Choirs)

Exception: For choral items, Grade 9 students may participate in either Junior or Senior Groups.

4.0 Selection of Items

Item Selection Rules

- 4.1 Schools are encouraged to prioritize group items over solo items to provide participation opportunities for a larger number of students.
- 4.2 Each school is allowed a maximum of five (5) entries, with only one entry permitted per item.

4.3 The selection of items should adhere to the following guidelines:

5.0 Stages of the Contest:

Refer to the Ministry of Education, Higher Education and Vocational Education Website for information on the following:

5.1 The Contest is conducted in two stages:

First Round at Provincial Level - 1st May 2025, onwards

Final Round - National Level - 20th May 2025 onwards

- Date of posting Set music on Website 24th February 2025
- The Provincial Level of the competition will be conducted by the Ministry of Education, Higher Education and Vocational Education in collaboration with the respective Provincial Education Offices.
- 5.2 There should be at least 25 entries of the total items for the first round of the competition to be conducted at the Provincial Level. In the event of fewer entries, the Provincial Level competition may be conducted by combining two provinces.

5.3 Those obtaining First place at the Provincial level will qualify for participation at the National level and the next two highest-scoring schools from all participants per item will be selected to compete at the National level.

5.4 Award Announcement Statement

The awards for the first, second, and third places will be determined based on the marks achieved by the participating schools.

- **First Place:** Awarded to the school with the highest overall score.
- **Second Place:** Awarded to the school with the second-highest overall score.
- Third Place: Awarded to the school with the third-highest overall score.

In addition to these awards, two **Merit Awards** will be presented to the highest-scoring schools at the **National Level**, recognizing their exceptional achievements.

- Music for the dance could be live or recorded.
- Avoid repetition of dance presentations made in the previous two years (2022/2023)
- Costumes should be appropriate for a school performance.
- Marks will not be allocated for costumes at the Provincial Level.
- All dancers should be dressed in simple appropriate costumes at the National Level

7.0 Music

- 7.1. The relevant set of music can be downloaded from the Ministry of Education, Higher Education and Vocational Education's website www.moe.gov.lk and no other version of the set piece will be accepted.
- 7.2. In addition to the set song/ piece, a Choice Song/ Piece should be performed. The Choice Song/piece can be of any version and **cannot be changed** at the National level.
- 7.3. The choice pieces should be a Western classical, modern or film music composition.

- 7.4. A copy of the music's full score in respect of all choice pieces should be handed over to the judges on the day of the competition at the Provincial and National level, before their performance. A penalty of Five (5) marks will be imposed on competitors who do not comply with this requirement.
- 7.5. All schools should submit a printed list of the names of participants including each student's name, grade and their respective signatures certified by the principal on the day of the competition.

No school will be permitted to participate in the competition without submitting the above-mentioned details before the event.

8.0 Teachers accompanying students to the venue of the competition.

8.1. Where the number of students is 18 or less, 2 teachers should accompany the students, and for every additional 10 students, there should be an extra teacher.

9.0 Payment

9.1. Please note that **no** payments will be made to teachers or students.

10.0 Application

10.1. All applications must be submitted online by the **10**th **of March 2025** through the following link: https://forms.gle/Yj5tXLpq2AYLYGjh8 to conform to the specimen form given.

A printed copy of the form certified by the Principal must be forwarded by Registered Post to the following address to reach on or before 15th of March 2025.

- 10.2 The Principal should certify that the trainer of the item is either the Western music teacher /member of the staff or a hired professional.
- 10.3 Each item should be on a separate Application Form. (They may be mailed in one envelope)
- 10.4 Any withdrawal of an item or from the entire competition must be made to reach the Ministry in writing 10 days before the Provincial Round.

NOTE: The Panel of Adjudicators' decision is final. Those challenging the decision of the Panel will be disqualified. No Correspondence in this regard will be entertained.
