National Level Festival of Foreign Languages - 2025

English and Foreign Languages Branch of the Ministry of Education, Higher Education and Vocational Education has organised a National Level Festival of Foreign Languages for the first time under the theme of 'One World Many Voices' with the primary aim of enhancing the knowledge of foreign languages and their use among the students in the government schools, government approved private schools and Pirivena institutions in Sri Lanka.

- 02. The National Level Festival will be held for Japanese, Korean, Chinese, French, German and Hindi languages taught in the schools based on the number of students studying in Grade 10,11,12 and 13.
- 03. The types of events:
 - 1. Written events - Dictation, Creative Writing
 - 2. Performing events Oratory (Impromptu)
- 04. Participants are expected to use accepted Standard Foreign Language according to the syllabus in all the events.
- 05. The events will be conducted at two levels following the time schedule given. (The dates are subjected to change due to amendments of the school calendar.)

From 15th September to 25th November

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07. The Festival is open to all Grades 10-13 students who are following the above foreign languages. Two students from each school can participate in each event. Each participant can take part only in two events.

Provincial Level events - 1st, 2nd and 3rd places will be selected from each category under each foreign language and only the 1st and the 2nd places are eligible to participate in the National level events.

National Level events -1^{st} , 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} places will be selected from each category under each foreign language.

08. Inform all schools teaching the above foreign languages in your province about the Festival and encourage them to participate.

The instructions given must be adhered to in planning, organizing, conducting, judging and keeping records of the Festival.

General Instructions on conducting the festivals of Foreign Languages - 2025

01. Dictation - Grades 10-13

In this event, number of sentences/ a passage and a list of 10 words will be dictated. The list of 10 words will be only marked to avoid any tie in the event. These sentences and the list of words are based on relevant textbooks or prescribed resource materials given in the syllabus published by the National Institute of Education and the Department of Educational Publications.

Note -

- Candidates should write all the numerical values in letters.
- In Japanese Language, candidates should write all words in Kanji that appears in the textbook/syllabus.

1.1. The Dictation event is administered as follows:

First Reading: The selected sentences/passages are read at normal conversational speed during which competitors are not allowed to write. They must listen to the reading carefully.

Second Reading: The participants will be asked to write at the second reading. The sentences/passages are read in meaningful chunks. Instruct the students to write the extra words in the form of a vertical list.

Third Reading: This reading begins after a pause of 1 minute after the second reading. The sentences/passages and the list of words are read again in meaningful chunks at normal conversational speed.

At the end of the third reading, there will be a pause of two minutes. Participants must use this time to check spelling, capitalization and punctuation, if relevant.

- Announce the end of the event.
- Instruct the participants to lay their pens down and the entry upside down on their desks. Each participant will hand over his/her entry to the supervisor and walk out at the end of the event. They can walk out only after entry has been collected.

- List of 10 words to avoid any ties.
 - > These words should be read twice. There should be 30 seconds break between the two readings.
 - > Inform the participants that all the words should be started with simple letters in the relevant languages.

1.3 Marking Criteria

Participants' work will be judged in accordance with the original sentences/passages on the following criteria on a countdown system of marking from 100. (If any clarification is needed, the second judge's notes can be referred):

- i. Accuracy of spelling Mark every error. Reduce 1 mark for each error. If the same word is misspelt several times in the sentence/passage, it is counted as one error.
- ii. Reduce 1 mark for each punctuation error.
- iii. Omission or Addition of words If a word is omitted, it is also counted as one error. Similarly, if a word is added, that is counted as an error. Reduce 2 marks for each omission and one mark for each addition.
- iv. In the case of no error-free entries, the marking panel has to decide the minimum number of errors for placement.

2.0 Creative Writing

2.1 General Guidelines

2.1.1 The participants are required to write a story / a dialogue based on a given picture/pictures. These pictures will be selected based on the themes in the syllabus / prescribed texts. The themes must be selected within the experiences and interests of the children of the particular grade.

3.0 Oratory - Impromptu (Grade 10 - Grade 13)

The topics should be determined based on the subject content of the relevant grades. The competency levels of the participants should be considered in each of the grades when preparing the topics. Separate classrooms should be arranged to hold the event. The participant must face the panel of judges when delivering the speech. There should be a distance of about 3 meters between the participant and the judges.

3.1 Guidelines to conduct Oratory - Impromptu:

• Each participant will be given the topic 10 minutes before they are due to present the speech.

- No participant should be allowed to exceed this timing in order to ensure that all the competitors are given an equal time for preparation.
- The participant who are awaiting their turn for preparation should be kept in a separate classroom to avoid them gaining any advantage by possessing prior knowledge of the kind of topics being given.
- After the topic is given to the first participant, the next participant should be called only after 5 minutes to the room where the event is held.
- Judges should ensure that only those two participants are kept in the room where the event is held.
- Prior to the event, give clear instructions to all the participants at the waiting room.
- The time allowed for this event is three minutes.
- A warning bell should be sounded at two minutes and a final bell at three minutes.

4.0 Documents and Formats

- A participant must possess a valid Identity Card (Postal /National / Passport or a photograph certified by the principal).
- Provincial level results must be submitted to the Ministry of Education using only the MS Excel format (Annexe 01) via email to <u>englishunitmoe@gmail.com</u>.
- The entry forms issued by the Ministry of Education (Annexe 02) must be duly completed, certified by the principal, and submitted at the registration desk on the day of the national event.

5.0 Special Instructions

- All participants must wear a basic school uniform. To ensure anonymity and reduce bias, identifying features like monograms must be covered during events.
- The decisions rendered by the judges shall be final and binding at all stages of the event.
- For the impromptu speech event, each participant shall be evaluated by a panel of three qualified judges.
- All matters related to the Festival shall be kept strictly confidential at all times.
- In addition to the general marking criteria, refer to the specific criteria provided for the French language creative writing and dictation events. (Annexe 03)

French Language (Creative Writing / Dictation)

Type of errors

- Grammatical errors (Ex. conjugations, formation of plural words, placement of accents, placement of apostrophe, etc.)
- Lexical errors (Wrong spelling of words, wrong placement of accents Ex. Pin instead of pain, ecole instead of école)
- Segmentation (Ex. au'jourdhui instead of aujourd'hui, loreille instead of l'oreille)
- Homophones words that sound the same (Ex. sang, son, cent, s'en sound the same but written differently depending on the context).
- Wrong capitalization of proper nouns, countries, cities, subject nouns, pronouns etc. (Ex. paris instead of Paris, france instead of France).
- Wrong capitalization of days/months etc. (Ex. Janvier instead of janvier, Mars instead of mars)
- Omission or Addition of letters If a letter/letters is/are omitted or extra letter(s) are added, it is also counted as an error. (Ex. le ne instead of le nez, la télévisionne instead of la télévision).
- Omission of hyphen (Ex. Rendez vous instead of rendez-vous)
